

Review of: "How Competent are Health Professionals in Delivering Nutrition Education? A Cross-Sectional Study in Ebonyi State, Nigeria"

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Potential competing interests: No potential competing interests to declare.

The title talks about whether professionals are competent to educate in nutrition, but it does not talk about self-perception, which is part of the study.

"The questionnaire was adapted and modified from the general nutrition knowledge questionnaire", it is not clear if the modified Kliemann questionnaire was used or if this was also modified.

Compared to two professions with a large sample, physiotherapists, dietitians and dentists, they may distort the study more than provide any benefit due to their very small samples, in any case they would not be comparable.

Table 5 is not adequately explained in the text, it only shows the assessment of nutrition education competency and the text talks about other concepts.

Subjecting marital status to statistics as a predictor of competence in nutritional education (Table 6) does not make sense and gender would need an explanation as to whether it can be a predictor.

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
