## Review of: "OpenAI ChatGPT Generated Content and Similarity Index: A study of selected terms from the Library & Information Science (LIS)"

The topic is timely as it seems that the question of whether the text generated by Chat GPT will be detected as copying or potential plagiarism by Turnitin.

The study is very straightforward - just creating samples of text with Chat GPT and then feeding them into Turnitin.

A couple of observations are in order. The texts should also be evaluated in other respects (correctness, language, how well they match the expected underlying task, at least).

Secondly, there is a related Turnitin post (from January, 2023). From that, it is clear that it should be reported which Turnitin version is used and, in particular, if the "Turnitin's AI writing and ChatGPT detection capability" has been used in the Turnitin version.

Just a minor point - while it is possible to Google for how much is a "lakh", it would be nicer to give numerical figures in a form more easily digested by the readers from different countries.
