Inequality in healthcare services within and between nations has long been a major concern and is yet to be addressed fully. Consequently, the author is complimented for choosing a topic that is most relevant to our AI-enabled times and thanked for his effort.

The manuscript, however, appears to be disjointed and too brief. Inclusion of greater relevant details (supported by more references) and ensuring a logical flow of thoughts/ideas/concepts would add value to the paper. Each idea/concept should be developed adequately (and preferably with examples), and it should lead to the next logical idea/concept in the succeeding paragraph.

While the author focuses on the costs involved in developing Al-enabled technologies, and that prohibitive costs may restrict access to a limited few, it is also true that properly validated Al-enabled tools may help service large swathes of populations at lower costs in the future, and possibly lead to greater equitable distribution of healthcare services.

The abrupt introduction of 'empathy' in the last paragraph appears irrelevant with respect to the subject heading.

The author is requested to consider the above-made suggestions and try to revise the manuscript accordingly.
