

Review of: "In-Vitro Antibacterial Activity of some Ganoderma Species: A Review"

The abstract requires improvement, particularly with regard to providing more information about Ganoderma. I suggest initiating the manuscript with a detailed description of Ganoderma, rather than focusing on the Diabetic Foot Ulcer, as it is not the primary theme of the manuscript. Has Ganoderma been previously utilized to address diabetic foot ulcers? This topic appears nonsensical within the text; the authors should establish a meaningful connection to the context.

The text also requires improvement in English, and there are paragraphs that are excessively lengthy. I recommend breaking down these paragraphs for better readability. Additionally, incorporating more pertinent references into the manuscript would enhance its value. Other details require refinement as listed below:

- While the authors have categorized the Ganoderma species, the initial ones lack significant information. Therefore, I
 recommend avoiding the separation of topics in this context.
- There was a lack of reference in the topic of antimicrobial activity.
- The conclusion did not align with the content of the text.
