The study approval should have been made through the Gambia government ethics committee, but they did not do that; instead, they sought approval from the University of The Gambia, which is a new university and its ethics committee is young in the field of ethical work in research.

There seems to be bias because the way they selected their study participants has some bias in it, which is minimal.

The study participants are more Gambian, and based on the study title, it seems he enrolled more Gambians than other nationals who you can find in rural Gambia, especially in the area where the study was conducted.
