

Review of: "Participatory budgeting for public involvement in environmental sustainability at a Thai university"

This research is of good quality exploring the concept of participatory budgeting in a university setting for promoting sustainability. The research topic is up-to-date and is relevant to advancement of green university and SDGs.

In general, the article is well written; however, there are few points that could be addressed to improve the quality.

- Sentences in the abstract should have been differentiated (paraphrased) from other sections of the article.
- The article should have a conclusion to provide a concise snapshot of the result.
- In the methodology section, the number of eligible voters should be stated.
- There are rooms to improve the discussion. The refecction of participatory budgeting in a university setting (typical budgeting processes in the university) should be included, since the university is a unique setting – much more flexible to adapt the budgeting process. Furthermore, using more references to contrast or substantiate the discussion will benefit the article.
