In my opinion, the Abstract should be reduced to the essential and many statements must be explained and supported by references. In addition, the author should be more careful and use scientific language. I think there is a lot of work to be done.

Please see some examples:

- "...to grow the overall pie". Please use scientific language
- "The European Innovation Action INCULTUM...". This is out of context.
- "Bargaining in the sense of cross-reaction is seen as the science of everything..." What does this mean? Who saw that?
- "On the other hand, tourism (Travel & Tourism Sector is one of the most important human activities generating 10.3% of global income (Global GDP, WNTO 2019) and 12% of global employment. Why the other hand? What is in the first hand?
- "The idea to keep at the forefront of all travel is this: Do no harm. Even better: Do good as directed by the locals." Where does came that idea? Please use references.
- "Over the years, travelers have embraced a sense of entitlement." What does this mean?
- "Those working in the tourism industry need to establish protocols, guidelines and expectations...". The protocols, guidelines, etc. are well-defined (please see the literature on the Tourism sector).
- "In the event that the residents are not hoteliers, then game relations and contradictions develop between community residents and tourism businesses." Only when the residents aren't hoteliers? Please give some examples.
- "Game relationship between residents and tourism businesses". Is this a subsection title?
