The article touches on a very interesting and relevant topic, which should always be considered in the implementation of global policies on ecosystem conservation. However, it is necessary to place greater emphasis on the methodology to give greater seriousness to the document and so that it does not seem so anecdotal. Although it is mentioned that the method used was interviews under strict anonymity, it would be interesting to know the total number of surveys, how many were done with the indigenous community, how many with NGO officials, how many with government officials; how many questions each survey had, to present the models of each survey according to the target population, to mention the total recording hours (if the interviews were recorded), etc. In summary, give a more analytical nature to the data collected. It would be interesting if more were written about the indigenous community interviewed, the traditional uses of the forest, and something about their worldview of nature. It would also be very constructive to know the author's opinion on the difficulties he faced when approaching each of the actors and what he recommends changing for future similar studies. The bibliography is relevant but could be expanded further, and in this way, achieve greater citation of sources in all paragraphs of the text.
