This policy dialogue is too generalised. It should relate to the specific malnutrition issues among adolescent girls and women in Rwanda, the required policy measures to achieve the relevant United Nations Sustainable Goals (SDGs). Include the malnutritional barriers, the strategic priorities, key multisectoral actions to meet the SDGs and identify some key challenges. The statements in the paper need to be supported by in-text references e.g.- In Rwanda, anaemia prevalence is higher among pregnant women (25%)For instance the specific contribution of women in Rwanda to achieve SDG2 in ending hunger, achieving agri-food security (in relation to technology, strengthen adaptation to climate changes, access to financial resources), improving nutrition (health sector) and in the promotion of sustainable agriculture.
