Upon reviewing the article titled "The imperative of a comprehensive One Health approach for mosquito-borne disease control in Indonesia," I share the concerns raised by fellow reviewers. The lack of a clear explanation of how the implementation of One Health would directly align with the proposed objectives is noteworthy. I agree with the need for concrete data on the current situation, as well as a cost/benefit analysis and specific examples of deficiencies in surveillance and control systems, as pointed out by other reviewers.

Furthermore, the focus of the article appears to be generic and could be applied to various countries, potentially limiting its contribution to specific scientific knowledge relevant to Indonesia's situation. Concerns regarding the lack of depth in addressing the One Health approach and the absence of clear definitions for specific terms are also shared among fellow reviewers.

In conclusion, I encourage the author to consider incorporating the constructive suggestions provided, such as delving into specific data about Indonesia, conducting a thorough cost/benefit analysis, and offering clearer definitions. These refinements have the potential to transform the article into a more impactful and region-specific contribution to the field. I commend the author's efforts and look forward to seeing the continued development of this research with these considerations in mind.
