Review of: "Web-Based Crime Management System for Samara City Main Police Station"

Overall, the research is coherent as an idea and an applied project. The researcher's effort is outstanding, and the work is good. However, from an academic and scientific perspective, it needs improvement. It presents a real problem and offers a practical solution. The methodology is clear, and the technical details (software + hardware) are very good. However, the academic language is weak, repetitive, and the references are few. The research needs to be supported with more recent sources. The objectives and importance were formulated as an implementation plan. The analysis is lengthy and needs to be reformulated and focused more precisely. The goal was to develop an automated system for managing crime records. It is web-based and describes its ease of use. However, it is limited to a single scope of work and does not mention that it can be generalized to more than one workplace, nor can the system be expanded and made general. The recommendations are limited and do not mention the possibility of improving and developing the system. The researcher did not address the methods of protection and security it provides or the possibility of training employees to enable it to operate. The researcher was suggested to include recent research (2020 and beyond) on web-based crime management systems to support the research rationale, focusing on data security and digital record protection, as well as automating traditional processes in police stations. The system will be expanded to include more than one police station, and staff will be trained on how to use the system to ensure optimal use.
