The article is a noteworthy, novel attempt in exploring some significant topics related to knowledge, the construction of knowledge and the perspectives of knowledge. The writing style and structure is 'indigenous' and suits the topic very well. The discussion tempts the educationists and researchers to be innovative and sincere in dealing with ontology and epistemology, irrespective of the subject/research topics.

However, the article could benefit from some revisions: (i) including a brief introduction to Blackfoot and Blackfoot Resilience, (ii) positioning the current discussion amidst the existing scholarship, (iii) referring more to similar yet global indigenous identities on the periphery of discussions and (iv) by offering more insights into question the dominant and stereotypical discourses on relevant topics.
