Congrats for this simple and objective descriptions of the main issues on Catholicity.

I would like to highlight here only two points:

- 1. The statement that God created "everything out of nothing" (1. Creation), according to Gen 1, seems not so compactible with Catholic perspective that is nowadays inclined to Theist evolutionism. In this point it is most probable that Catholic scholarship understands that the Bible reading is to be compatible with evolution than the contrary.
- 2. The assumption that Israel "returned to infidelity" (3. Covenant) and so felt in the hands of foreign peoples suggests that Christianity did not. However, Israel felt by breaking the Torah according to the Prophets, and the history of Christianity witnesses the same fall from the Torah.
