6. The sample size (103) taken from only one matrimonial site (Reddit) is considered small and could potentially lead to misleading generalizations of the results. Consider discussing the limitations of the sample size and its implications on the generalizability of findings.
7. To enhance the validity of your results, consider comparing them with findings from previously published papers in the literature, particularly in the context of other countries.
8. Based on your results, it would be beneficial to elaborate on why hypergamy has emerged as the most influential factor in determining partner preferences. Providing theoretical or empirical explanations can strengthen the discussion section.
9. Please clarify under the "Funding" section whether the authors received funding for the research or not, for transparency and accountability. It seems confusing.
