1. The authors don't mention how they think the butterfly got there. Was it a natural dispersal event, or is it possible that its arrival was due to larval stages being transported around on the ornamental plants (i.e., human-mediated dispersal)?
2. Are there any other species that this butterfly could have been confused with?
3. All species names should be italicised.
