- 3. Include the year of publication after referencing an author. E.g., 'Hegel...'
- 4. Briefly explain specific terms such as 'warranted assertibility', and 'pure knowledge'. Do not assume that the reader will automatically understand what you are referring to.
- 5. Flow of this paper: each paragraph takes a different philosopher/ educationalist to discuss. Consider ways to enhance the flow of the discussion by comparing and contrasting two or more philosophers within each paragraph.

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
