Moreover, at the very beginning, in the abstract, the authors says "The effects of technology on employment have become apparent due to its attendant consequences: rising inequality, rising unemployment, the rapid advancement of artificial intelligence (AI) and robotics, and increasing digital automation of manufacturing processes". It seems like that there is not a clear connection between the causes and the results. This unquestionably raises a number of significant concerns regarding the attempt to contribute to the subject matter that was suggested.

Editing the abstract as well as the content so that its goals, assumptions, and theoretical background are clearly resolved, its methodology is described, and its conclusions are contextualized with updated Nigeria's data is the recommendation that I have for the author in order to submit the manuscript again.

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
