

Review of: "Analysing the conglomeration of various urban pockets through the lens of environmental design for crime prevention: A case of Kolkata"

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The topic seems interesting but unfortunately the use of the English language is problematic. It almost reads as if large sections were translated from another language.

The first sentence in the abstract does not make sense: "Historically, the built fabric of Kolkata had a dynamic morphological influence". Morphology in itself refers to the built fabric, structure or form of cities. One might say there are multiple influences to the city's morphology but not that the built fabric itself had a dynamic morphological influence. The paper is difficult to understand because of the poor language. Again a sentence like: "The conurbation of urban agglomeration is a natural way forward to the proliferation of the population"; is difficult to understand. One would simply say that rapid urbanisation or the proliferation of the city's population leads naturally to conurbation OR urban agglomeration. The way the sentence is structured makes it seem like conurbation or agglomeration leads to proliferation. It is not easy to understand.

I cannot recommend this paper for publication in its current state. I would recommend it for proofreading and editing by a native English speaker or someone with proficient English language skills.
