

## Review of: "Viewing trauma as a developmental process emerging from chronic repeated experience and reiterated meaning-making mental processes"

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This article presents an alternative perspective to the idea that trauma is seen as an important cause of acute serious events and psychopathology. This view is based on developmental neuroscience, which suggests that functioning across the lifespan results from repeated experiences and processes. The nature of experience, aspects of brain development, and mechanisms of involvement of environmental resources and how these shape typical and atypical development are discussed.
