Review of: "Self, Dignity, and the Brain: A Critical Reflection on Psychology, Free Will, and Law"

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The article's topic is engaging, and the author writes well; however, the research faces significant difficulties regarding clarity and organization. Revisiting the longstanding debate on free will is crucial, especially considering recent discoveries about the brain. Nevertheless, this text lacks a clearly defined research proposal. While reigniting the age-old debate, especially in light of recent neuroscientific findings about the brain, is highly relevant, the paper currently lacks specificity. To truly make a novel contribution, the text would benefit from a more clearly defined and focused research proposal, careful revision of the argument structure, clearer subdivisions, and improved conceptual coherence. Additionally, neuroscience and law could be explored in greater depth, rather than broadly and superficially.
