The manuscript entitled "A Narrative Review on the Management of Severe COVID-19 Infection Using Stem Cell-based Therapies with a Focus on the Registered Clinical Trials," by Mahmoudi and colleagues, aims to show the cell-based therapies for severe COVID-19 infection. In general, the review is interesting, and the manuscript is, for the most part, well-written; the data provided was comprehensive and presented clearly. I only have minor comments that may help clarify the text.

- 1. The authors miss several key references. For example, the statement in section 7 ("In the severe SARS-CoV-2 infection, the respiratory alveoli are infiltrated with various immune cells such as neutrophils, macrophages, NK cells, and T cells, leading to high concentrations of inflammatory cytokines and a cytokine storm.") should include a proper reference. Please carefully examine all similar issues.
- 2. The English language and style must be improved throughout the manuscript, and it needs English editing.
- 3. The conclusion was somewhat superficial and not postulated according to the evidence provided.
