This paper examines the impacts of various environmental factors on public and private health expenditures, which has practicality. Also, I have some suggestions for how to make this article even better.

- 1. The background section is too lengthy. Some of the tables in this section can be displayed as attachments and do not need to be in the body of the text.
- 2. Some sections can be further graded. For example, section 3 can be subdivided into "3.1 Methods" and "3.2 Data".
- 3. The title of each section could be revised again with the aim of being more accurate and concise.
- 4. The same is true for the content. The information that has been introduced in the text does not need to be presented in a table anymore. If information is presented using a table, then the text needs to be more concise. For example, Table 5.
- 5. A discussion section is missing. Including but not limited to: analysis of the empirical results and their policy implications in terms of their reality, analysis of the impact mechanisms, and comparison with the results or views of previous studies
- 6. Section 3 contains "The study investigates the impacts of environmental variables through two parts", but the next section does not reflect these 2 parts.
- 7. The topic is about fiscal policy, but at the end of the summary there are issues about "political stability and absence of violence" that seem unrelated to fiscal policy.

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
