Review of: "How to (Better) Cite Aristotle in APA Format?"

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The article provides a clear and motivated proposal for the citation of the works of Aristotle in APA format. The authors emphasize the fact that the works of Aristotle are currently cited using various norms. In particular, the citation of the modern edition can be present in some cases while it is irrelevant in others. This article proposes a new consistent way of citing Aristotle. For more clarity, the authors could include some examples to show the contrast between the existing norms/practices of citation and the current proposal. The given examples do not show the difference with the existing norms, and thus the proposition is not easily understandable for novice users of citation styles.

Overall, the article is well organised, and the argument is easy to follow. The motivations for the proposition are clearly stated in the introduction.
