The paper deals with an interesting topic. However, in my understanding, the paper is quite lengthy. To make it a journal article, it should be framed in a structured way. Here are a few suggestions for the author for further refinement of the paper:

The search string for the literature search is clearly defined.

In the results section, it is mentioned that libraries are located in Asia (26.32%), Africa (21.05%), International (15.79%), Europe (10.53%), North America (5.26%), and Oceania (5.26%). What does 'international' mean?

It is better to mention here that the methodology used is Preferred Reporting Items for Systematic Reviews and Meta-Analyses (PRISMA).

Data analysis and results could be clubbed under a single heading, preferably under the results section.

Moreover, a few research questions are not aligned with the discussion; for example, library activities and individual librarians and library staff's contributions are perhaps not adequately dealt with.
