

# Review of: "The Anthropocene Borderline Problems"

This is a well-written, user-friendly, timely and transdisciplinary paper combining geology, especially stratigraphy and Earth System Sciences with politics and citizen action via STS (Science and Technology Studies). It explores the potential of different approaches to the Anthropocene (event vs. episode vs. epoch) in the lenses of expected agency of the notion in the face of contemporary human-activity-induced global crises.

There is not much to be corrected except for some minor editorial issues and – definitely highlighting the proposition of the author to distinguish the geological past and present as an idea for „Redesigning the Anthropocene Borderline Problem” – in the title, abstract and introductory part. It is a very interesting proposition that calls for amplification.
