Review of: "Medical Tourism in the Thessaly Region, Greece: Hotel Managers' Attitudes, Opinions, and Perspectives"

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Dear Author(s),

The present study is a good read but requires thorough amendments.

- 1). Firstly, the present study focuses exclusively on 4 and 5-star hotels in Thessaly, omitting lower-category hotels and other types of accommodations that may also play a role in medical tourism. This limits the generalizability of the findings to the entire hospitality sector in the region.
- 2). Secondly, it solely focuses on hotel managers and omits the views of other key stakeholders such as healthcare providers, patients, and policymakers, which are essential for a holistic understanding of medical tourism development.
- 3). Only **10%** of hotels are currently involved in medical tourism. Thus, opinions about its potential are **largely speculative** rather than based on operational experience.
