An oral medicine used to treat *type 2 diabetes*. Acarbose slows down the digestion of foods high in *carbohydrate*, such as rice, bread, milk, and fruit. The result is a slower and lower rise in *blood glucose* throughout the day, especially right after meals. Acarbose belongs to the class of medicines called *alpha glucosidase inhibitors*. (Brand name: *Precose*.)
