Definitely, there is an improvement in the second version. My suggestion is to revise the tables once again based on the comments given below:

- 1. Discrepancy in Table 4 as it has the same values and same statements as Table 3, but the title is different, which does not reflect the concept that was intended to measure.
- 2. Table 4, as regulatory barriers, is not reflected in the table. Basically, Table 3 is repeated.
- 3. Again, Table 5 is a mixture of 2 and 3, which needs to be relooked into.
- 4. Table 5's title is incomplete because I understand it is also one more category of barriers to IPC identified by the researcher, if not mistaken, and that barrier is the "knowledge and competencies of the pharmacist as a barrier to IPC." It is incomplete in Table Title 5; therefore, it is not clear. It is seen that items (4-9) from Table 2 and items 11-14 from Table 3 have the same values. If it is difficult to separate, then address all the barriers as one table. Redundancy in the results is a real waste of time for the reader.
- 5. Under discussion, the definition by WHO on IPE is incomplete.
- 6. Please attach the tool/instrument used as supplementary data to cross-check the tables if they reflect the same.
