Limited Exploration of Facilitator Characteristics

- The paper discusses the importance of co-facilitation but does not delve deeply into the specific characteristics, skills, or experiences that make a facilitator effective. Future research could examine how different attributes of facilitators (e.g., years of experience, training background, personality traits) influence group dynamics and outcomes.

Effect of Group Size

- The study does not examine how the size of the group affects the facilitation process and the experiences of the participants. Research could explore the optimal group size for maximizing learning and engagement in experiential groups.
