It deals with an issue of great interest, an architectural design strategy that prevents and/or reduces crime situations in public space. But the way the article is structured seems to need a bit more work. A developed theoretical framework section is missing, as well as a more detailed methodology section specifying the nature of the methodology used and the reasons for its choice. I suggest to explore the participation intervention, methodology more linked to a final proposal. A more detailed description of the way in which the different data collection techniques have been used is also advisable. Regarding the discussion of the results, it is expected to find a line of reasoning, based on the theory that should have been in a previous section, supported by the results. From the way they are written they seem more like project intentions having lost the scientific contribution expected in a scientific paper.
