This is a good case report highlighting the potential of Ramipril to cause angioedema. Swelling of the lips, face, tongue, and difficulty in breathing are documented adverse effects of the drug; although, these effects occur in 0.1 to 0.7% of recipients. Studies have also shown that it is five times more common in Africans. The import of this case report is that the rarity should be borne in mind when prescribing this drug. It would be interesting to know the descent of this index case. Including the pathophysiology of the angioedema would have been helpful.
