The Authors focus on "Diabetic foot infections (DFI) are composed of a mixture of Gram-positive *\$taphylococcus aureus*, *Bacillus subtilis*, *Streptococcus*, *and Enterococcus spp.*) and Gram-negative (*Escherichia coli*, *Klebsiella pneumoniae*, *Morganella morganii*, *Entrobacter*, *Pseudomonas*, *Citrobacter*, *Salmonella* and *Proteus* sp.)" bacteria, and *Ganoderma* species are beneficial as antimicrobial agents against these microorganisms.

"There are still several steps that you need to go through before your manuscript will be published. *A few general points, kindly clarify it*".

- 1. In PAGE NO 3, Ganoderma australe, the Author stated that "These are just a few examples of Ganoderma species, and there are many more within the genus such as G. pfeifferi, G. oregonense, G. multipileum. G. adspersum, G. sessile, G. lipsiense, G. colossus, G. curtisii, G. lobatum, G. mbrekobenum, G. sinense, G. tornatum, G. tuberculosum, G. zonatum, G. miniatocinctum, and G. weberianum, etc". This paragraph should be written in the section "Ganoderma and its species". Please clarify it.
- 2. After Authors immediately started "Hypoglycemic activity of *Ganoderma species*" Kindly *incorporate* under the relevant *headings*: **Hypoglycemic activity of** *Ganoderma species*". Under this heading, authors can write about the hypoglycemic activity of some *Ganoderma species*. Please clarify it.
- 3. Table 1: Please write the relevant topic that represents the table contents. Kindly clarify it.
- 4. Kindly write which purposes Ganoderma species are used for in traditional medicine. Check the manuscript again.
- 5. A genus (or genus group) is always italicized, and the first letter should be capitalized, even when not paired with a species or subspecies name. Please check carefully.
- 6. Please write Silver nitrate (AgNO3). Starting a sentence with an abbreviation is generally avoided in formal writing. Check abbreviations thoroughly and write them in the correct place.
- 7. Write the complete name of a microorganism, for example, *Staphylococcus aureus*, in the whole manuscript.... So make it the same like ...do not write *S. aureus*. Needs to be checked all and corrected.
- 8. In the manuscript, some were written *Ganoderma lucidum* and some were written *G. lucidum*. Please write the same way. Check all species once again.
- 9. What is measuring  $14.13 \pm 0.12$  mm, and what is measuring  $13.03 \pm 0.12$  mm? "Measured zone of inhibition with values....., respectively.
- 10. Please revise your review article carefully.
