Dear Editors and Authors,

- 1. The keywords "post vaccine SARS CoV 2 infection" and "vaccine safety" are not included in MeSH. It should be changed.
- 2. In the "Study Design" and "Sample size" sections, it would be appropriate to give a figure or table number instead of "Detailed questionnaire has been provided in the supplementary material" and "Flow diagram representing detailed sampling approach has been provided in the supplementary material."
- 3. It should be noted that this article does not give a time frame for side effects and does not clarify whether these side effects are due to the vaccine. The phrase "after the vaccine" is very vague.
- 4. Terms such as episode 1-2 were not clearly explained to patients during COVID symptom questioning. Episode 1-2 should be clearly stated in the article and in the questions. the period you mentioned and the patient's may not be the same.
- 5. I would expect a comparison between vaccines in terms of side effects. I wondered if there was a significant difference in terms of side effects. It would be nice to see the p value in the percentage tables you made.
- 5. The subject is an intriguing subject and well written. Thank you for your efforts.
- 6. Suggestions can be modified and published.
