

Review of: "Exploring the Factors Aggravating Disease Transmission in Healthcare Environments: Strategies for Mitigation"

This is a review of the literature on factors associated with the transmission of diseases in health facilities, and proposals for their solution.

Below are some comments that could be useful to strengthen the manuscript, in the order of its sections:

2. Locational Insights: Disease Transmission

In the second subtopic of this section, "Establish and enforce strict biosafety protocols" is proposed as a solution, as if these protocols were not available. Perhaps the solution should be more oriented towards the evaluation of the implementation of protocols and their possible update or adaptation to each specific area and environment. This could be the basis for the solution proposals for the other subtopics.

Before section 2, the methodology of the literature review that was carried out should be described.

3. Government's Crucial Role in Disease Transmission Control

In this section, in addition to proposing strategies for training programs to address the possible lack of knowledge or updating of health personnel, it would be important to recognize the importance of the attitude of the personnel and make proposals. Among other actions, awareness-raising and recognition of their work could be considered as contributions to public health.

My evaluation is based on the above, for which the lack of description of the methodology is very important, without which it is not replicable.
