

## Review of: "The Impact of TikTok on Students: A Literature Review"

Exploring the world of TikTok through a literature review is a great idea, but to make it really effective, it's important to have a clear and consistent line of discussion throughout your paper.

Let's take a look at the sections on academic influences and mental health – they could use a bit of a makeover to develop your arguments more, for example put the academic sections together (may consider an age range here, for example are you looking at teenagers or young adults in the review). You can then also do the same for the wellbeing and mental health ones (combine and separate out positives and negatives). Also, it's a bit unclear what you're trying to say about the learning opportunities on TikTok. Maybe we can make that clearer and more adolescent friendly.

I noticed that your paper seems like it has been worked on but could use a bit more polishing. For example, the "choking challenge" and TikTok being a benefit to society might not go well together in the same sentence. Also, there are some inconsistencies in your references which ideally are all reported in the same way, equally it might help to define abbreviations to make it easier for readers to follow.

When you're discussing implications, it's good to focus on things that are realistically achievable. For instance, instead of saying suicidal matters shouldn't be widely shared (which might be hard to control), maybe suggest educating users on how to have conversations about it and directing them to sources of support. You have quite a few conclusions in your paper. Maybe try narrowing it down to two or three that really support your main points. This can make your arguments more convincing.

Overall, it's a bit unclear what your paper is advocating for and why. Even within the sections on education and well-being, the arguments seem a bit all over the place. Let's try to make it more focused and easier for everyone to understand. You might want to try revising your writing plan and seeing if a different structure would help strengthen your overall arguments some more. A really solid start and once its been more developed would be interesting and useful paper on the use of Tik-tok.
