I believe that this paper has the potential to be an important contribution to the fields of ecotheology and missiology. However, there are certain elements of the article that need further development before it is ready for publication.

In terms of organization, I suggest the authors strengthen the clarity and scope of their introduction because there are paragraphs in the methodology and discussion that feel more appropriate for the introduction, especially the methodology's second half. That is to say, the authors need to emphasize the scope and importance of their arguments from the very beginning.

In addition, a brief discussion of the trends of missiology in Indonesia seems necessary to help readers understand why missions in this country needs to take an ecological turn. How have trends in missiology run parallel to ecological destruction in Indonesia? Adding a literature review section could help to clarify the academic and historical contexts that inform the authors' discussions.

The exegesis is perhaps the most effective part of the article. As a reader, I would like to see more of this as it illuminates how the authors' arguments are grounded in theological reasoning.

Once more, the authors discuss an important topic, one that needs further exposure. Thus, I hope that, after making adjustments, this paper finds an avenue for publication.
