The abstract does not include methods, the most prominent results, or the conclusion.

The work is supposed to be a systematic review, we did not see that in the manuscript.

The methods did not clarify the number of papers allocated, nor did the number of papers included or excluded.

The reasons for rejecting some papers were not mentioned.

The results of previous studies were not compared, nor were the results of any previous study mentioned.

Studies that used traditional treatment methods must be mentioned in the methods section. We also did not find a comparison of these results with the results of studies that used nanotherapy.

With which type of virus was the effectiveness greater? What is the evidence?

The results are devoid of any meta-analysis

There is no explicit presentation of the results and no relevant discussion.

Paragraphs of the manuscript must be rephrased to suit the title.

The manuscript in this form is a literature review and not a systematic review, so I suggest changing the title to a literature review.
