A really interesting topic and one that is very topical at the moment. I have some suggestions to help improve the paper.

I think who the article is focused on is unclear. The title says students, but many sections are about young people, one is on college students and one on academic performance. Please make clear in the introduction if your review focuses on all students, ie school, college, university or if the focus is more generally on young people, perhaps change the title.

In the section of the introduction starting social media has become ... it is unclear if the §t two sentences are part of the one reference at the end. You would need to reference this as it relates to specific facts that need to be verified.

Overall, this is something throughout the paper that needs to be edited. There are many sections where there is a whole paragraph on one reference and it isn't clear if you are making statements or referring to the authors work. In general, I suggest only writing a few sentences per author when summing up literature and then drawing some conclusions from this.

Overall this does not feel like a literature review, rather summaries of the literature. A literature review should provide some analysis, discuss gaps, compare or group authors, rather than large summaries from individual authors.

In one paragraph you say "We", are these direct quotes from articles? If they are you need quotation marks, if not you need to paraphrase more generally.

I would suggest some consistency with referring to authors. Sometimes you list authors names in full, other times you don't (just an endnote to the reference), be consistent. You also should be using introducing statements to signal it is the authors work, ie In a study on Tiktok and productivity ... and you don't need to reference full titles of articles in the text, instead abbreviate, in their study on ...

Great start and I hope the suggestions are helpful to you in your revision of the article.
