

Review of: "Nasal Carriage of *Staphylococcus aureus* and Antibigram among Medical Undergraduate Students of a Private University in Ogun State, Nigeria"

Generally, the manuscript is acceptable with clear objectives and findings, however it requires a proper correction on the grammars and language formatting. Below are my comments,

1. Title - It's suggested to change the title of the manuscript to include risk factor eg. 'Risk Factors, Antibigram and Nasal Carriage of *Staphylococcus aureus* among Medical Undergraduate Students in Ogun State, Nigeria'
2. Abstract – many grammatical errors, the conclusion made were non relevant to the work done eg. pertaining to risk factors and policy and regulations etc.
3. Introduction – many grammatical errors with improper citation. The first paragraph is recommended to be removed as it is pertaining to the nose (skin) rather than focusing on the nostril.
4. Methodology - the study duration, area, design, selection, eligibility and size calculation are too detailed and is recommended to be combines as a single heading (eg. Experimental design). Sampling size calculation is not relevant to be detailed.
5. It is strongly recommended to rewrite the methodology section as it has many redundant information (eg. AST technique is common especially Kirby Bauer method doesn't require detail explanation)
6. Results – many redundant tables and figures. It is recommended to combined and simplified the data (instead of using raw data). The figures or AST is not properly labelled and it is suggested to use a better figure of AST plate.
7. Discussion - many grammatical errors with improper citation. Usage of English is poor here at this section hence many sentences require paraphrasing.
8. Conclusion – Recommended to rewrite the conclusion summarized and conclude the actual research conducted.
