Both practical and theoretical implications/recommendations should be given.

Critical analysis is needed rather than just reporting.

The implications would be practical if the article has real findings/innovation.

Maintain the logical flow in writing throughout the article.

Academic language should be used rather than words like I, you, we, they, my, our, there, may be, etc.

English proofreading is also recommended.

Avoid grammatical mistakes, typo errors, spelling mistakes, etc.

Strictly follow the recommended referencing style.
