

## Review of: "[Review Article] Nanocarriers for Protein and Peptide Drug Delivery"

The manuscript entitled "Nanocarriers for Protein and Peptide Drug Delivery" is a review of the development of structure-based nanocarriers for drug delivery which has the potential to address the limitations associated with protein and peptide drug delivery. Regretfully, I believe that a topic as ambitious as this cannot be covered briefly in nine pages.

There are a few points to clarify/change-

- 1. The captions and the quality of figures 1 and 2 need to be improved.
- 2. The language used in several sections is suboptimal, leaving the reader unacquainted with the intended message.
- 3. The manuscript lacks extensive references to original literature, instead referencing other reviews, which does not justify the need for this specific review.
- 4. The manuscript lacks a thorough discussion of the protein corona formed by nanoparticles in the bloodstream, which is crucial for mechanism analysis and understanding the review's scientific basis.
- 5. The manuscript lacks sections on the applications and the current limitations on their use in clinics. This translational consideration can provide much more impact on the review.
