Dear Authors,

Thanks for drafting this interesting manuscript tackling an important issue which is related to the intention and hesitancy towards COVID-19 vaccination.

Below are some comments:

- Sample size, which was not calculated, and adoption of non-probability convenience sample are among the limitations.
- In the results section: those who received at least one dose should be equal to the sum of those received 1, 2, 3 and 4 doses (total is 405 not 398, mounting up to 94.6% of the total sample not sure how this variable was calculated).
- Since more than 94.6% have already at least one dose, the description of the hesitancy rates in the discussion section indicating that 22.4% were concerned about adverse effects,...) should be revised. Since hesitancy is an attitude towards getting vaccinated, already the majority of your study sample have been vaccinated.
- The main objective of the study is to determine the uptake, acceptance, and hesitancy. These terms are mixed up and the used study methodology has not met the objectives.

Final conclusion:

- This manuscript needs major revision.
