

Review of: "Phytochemical Analysis and Antioxidant Activity of Extracts from Berchemia zeyheri — A Swazi Medicinal Plant"

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Potential competing interests: No potential competing interests to declare.

- 1. No plant authority is included in the title of the journal and subsequently in the rest of the paper
- 2. In the abstract, there is no clear structure between the introduction, methodology, and the results
- 3. Keywords should immediately follow the abstract
- 4. Starting a sentence with "known" is improper (1. Introduction)
- 5. Each sentence under the introduction should be specific and should have a link to the next sentence
- 6. The description of the flowers and the fruit is vague and inconsistent with the rest of the paragraph (1. Introduction)
- 7. Generally, there is improper use of punctuation
- 8. Double-check your references throughout the journal
- 9. "et al.," should be "et al.",
- 10. "stem-bark" should be "stem bark"
- 11. Referring to "To the best of our knowledge, this is the first report of this kind, especially *B. zeyheri* collected in the Kingdom of Eswatini" is not needed in a scientific journal as it is
- 12. The manuscript should be written in the past impersonal tense. Using words like "our" and "we" is not acceptable
- 13. Specify each measurement used (Materials and methods)
- 14. When introducing a new plant (V. fausta), specify its relationship to the plant in focus
- 15. When referring to a table or a figure, it is not appropriate to write "refer to Table 1"; instead, it should be "Table 1"

OVERALL COMMENTS

- 1. The research carried out is very solid and informational
- 2. The use of correct words among sentences is crucial in passing the required information
- 3. Correct usage of punctuation
- 4. Consistent use of the right tense for the manuscript
