It is a very important and clinically relevant topic; however, fetal well-being is a very broad term which encompasses antenatal, intrapartum, and perinatal monitoring. The topic touches all areas inadequately. If it had focused on one area of surveillance, it would have created a major impact, like CTG as a tool of intrapartum fetal surveillance, stress tests, or antenatal non-stress tests in high-risk pregnancies. Antenatal surveillance is being more commonly done by biophysical profile rather than CTG. CTG is a part of BPP. Discussion in the article is also spread across wide areas without adequately addressing one specific area, and the results of the study are not elaborated. Needs gross revision.
