Review

1. Professional editors must revise, review, correct, and edit this article. It looks like a lengthy homily or a sermon. In no way it resembles systematic research. None of the sections in the article justifies a scientific presentation. Starting from the abstract, which has no order, each section must be rewritten and avoid repetitions.
 1. One of the examples of repetitions of the same sentences: this sentence in the introduction is exactly repeated in the second paragraph of the literature review. Plan here can be understood in two ways: *First*, as knowledge, vision, or understanding made before something happens, and that something will happen. This kind of pre-existing knowledge rests with God, who with only one powerful glance sees everything that has been, is, and will ever...
 2. Repetition of words: The anastrophe Greek way of life; behavior, behavior, behavior.
2. The colloquial form is used in most parts of the article: ex. Thanks God!
3. Many errors are found: The book of Ephesians. This should be 'the letter of St. Paul to the Ephesians.'
4. It needs to be clarified - Why is the research methodology explained? This is totally out of place.
5. The authors claim that this is quantitative research, but something needs to be mentioned about the respondents, questionnaire or statistical tests, etc.; this is very vague.
6. The text lacks logical presentation: After the names of the authors, the quotations are directly mentioned. There are no relations between the text and the reference made.
7. The results and discussion section is irrelevant. No result is discussed.
