Overall a good paper which highlights the need to reflect on the impact that AI may have in our lives and particularly in the job market. Whilst overall I believe that the paper is OK, there are further improvements needed to make it publishable.

For a start, there are a few typos in the introduction which could be made a bit more appealing. The explanations about the different types of AI and their implications to current jobs could also be made more explicit. The distinction made among the different types of AIs is good but the core topic of the paper "potential loss of jobs due to AI" should be tackled in each section of the paper. It is not clear for me why a dedicated section is assigned to Health and security, however, there are other domains where automation empowered by AI can have a big impact in jobs, e.g. logistics or manufacturing. I would merge these sections into a new chapter and also tackle other fields that may be affected by the introduction of AI.

If possible ground the latest chapters which are the main contribution of the paper with some quantitative evidences (at least from a historical retrospective) to sustain the main claim of the paper which states that jobs will be lost but most likely more new jobs will be created. This is also my view and desire, but another round of reflections on these sections referring to further literature and if possible to some quantitative data would make the paper better.
