The author has done a through job bringing thius vey important discussion to light. It is a discussion that needs to go on in many LMICs with a push for policies to change the status quo. The method of data colection is commendable even though women's voices are absent. My few comments/ observations to this contribution to literature are:

- a. The introduction and background can be merged into one section
- b. The fractional representation of KIs that responded to some questions as $\frac{1}{3}$ or in another section of the article, as one third, and the 45% in another section, be simply represented as 3 or 4 (as the case maybe) of the 11 participants indicate that....Especially as this is a qualitative paper and the sample size is not that large.
- c. The first sentence under section 5 (Recommendations) can be deleted.
