On the other hand, the very general and descriptive nature of this study needs serious revision. I would suggest in this case using the Axelrod tournament with the determination of the strategies of the main parties of conflict. Fortunately, the code to implement this model is available in the public domain. This would allow finding an answer to the question of which mediation strategies could be successful. As for ethical principles, it would be possible to use models of behavioral economics. Identifying the relevant heuristics of the main participants in the conflict would allow modeling the optimal way to resolve it. Supplementing the article with an appropriate model series would make it possible to transform it into a complete scientific study.
