1. **Title:** The contents (data) of the manuscript do not address the title. Therefore, the authors may think of rewording the title so that it can reflect the data available.
2. **Abstract:** The abstract has also not picked up the methodology, results, and findings of the manuscript.
3. **Introduction:** Is supposed to give some general facts on Ayurveda herbs and thereafter narrow down to the four herbs, namely water spinach, spine gourd, lotus, and water chestnut.
4. **Methodology:** The methodology is not descriptive enough; it raises a lot of unanswered questions.
5. **Results:** Need to be supported with a lot of facts like the antimicrobial potentials of the four herbs, the production rate, harvesting rate, export rates, etc.
6. **Discussion:** It did not really discuss the findings of the study. The findings are clear, so as the discussion.

Verdict: Major revision and resubmission for the second round review.
