A critical point that the authors have ignored is other dimensions of belief and implementation, which are accepted in the field of belief, but are rejected in practice and application. This discussion allows to follow up the epistemological foundations that have led to such a conflict.

In addition, it is suggested that the experience of similar countries, such as Iran, Iraq, and Afghanistan, should be discussed in more detail in the background section of the research.

You should also note that the legal right to property was recognized for women in Islamic countries much earlier than in other countries. This issue makes the conflict investigated in this research more fundamental, which deserves a deeper investigation.
